3. We must respond with Joyful Obedience (Dueteronomy 28:47-48)

Reminder: Proposed Constitutional Changes

The following changes to the ABMOPAD Constitution are being proposed to better align the ABMOPAD Board of Managers with the revised ABCOPAD leadership structure. Per our Constitution, the detail of these changes was published 90 days prior to the retreat. The summary of the proposed changes are as follows:

Delete Area Vice Presidents and add Corridor Directors for improved liaison with ABCOPAD

Delete reference to the Pittsburgh Baptist Association as a separate region.

Revise the Executive Committee to include the First Vice President.

Add Article 10A that authorizes non-voting assistants to certain members of the Board of Managers.

From the Editor

I recently started umpiring softball games. If you have ever been a sports official, then you can understand that when we are out on the field, everyone is watching what we do. All actions we take, calls we make, even the way we wear the uniform is scrutinized. They want us to mess up. Think about major league umpires you see on ESPN highlight reels. They are not there because they made a great call or did well on a routine play – they are on ESPN because they messed up. In the end, any loss is the fault of that “terrible ump who blew call after call”. There is no forgiveness whatsoever. Fair or unfair, it’s something that we simply need to deal with when officiating sports contests.

As Christians, we are subject to scrutiny as well. Sometimes people are watching just because they know you are a Christian and can’t wait to see you make a mistake just so they can rub it in. Other times, we are watched because they generally want to know how a Christian will react to a specific situation. Christ told us that we are the light of the world and that we cannot be hidden. We are to let our light shine for others to see so that they may see your goodness and give Glory to God.

When umpiring, the best way to prevent issues is by dedicating yourself to rule knowledge, mechanics and timing and by hustling on every play. It’s the same way

with being a Christian. We must dedicate ourselves to “rule knowledge” – the bible. Not just it’s “dos and don’ts” but everything in between. Jesus gives us a great example through which to pattern our lives, we only have to dedicate ourselves to that and follow his example. Our timing and mechanics are essential as well. If a friend that knows you to be a Christian starts to tell you about a problem or questions you about becoming a Christian, don’t just jump into a script of “I’ll pray for you”. Listen to them, hear them out. Sometimes you have to heal their bodies before you can heal their spirits. Jesus always took compassion on his followers and often took care of their worldly needs before ever launching into a sermon. He fed the hungry and healed the sick first, then he would tell them about the Kingdom. You also need to “hustle”. Basically, don’t be lazy. Take advantage of every opportunity to be Christ-like in your life. Just because you are with friends or because you are not at church doesn’t give an excuse to stop glorifying God.

In the end, we are all judged by the only judge that matters, and that is the Righteous Judge. We will mess up, it’s a given. But we are also forgiven, through the blood of the Lamb of God, Jesus Christ. His death and resurrection has secured for us a place in the Kingdom. The most simple rule in the book is the most important one: Follow Him.
